On 2^{nd} February over 100 people gathered for Rev Martin Walker's last communion service and farewell party at St Andrew's. The choir were in good voice and the beautiful eucharist service was a fitting goodbye to our Rector Martin who has served us all in the benefice for the last 5 1/2 years. Afterwards there were tributes and a toast and the formal return of the church keys to the benefice church wardens. Over £1200 was raised by the people of Wivey and the Hills as a gift for Martin to thank him for all he has done during his time with us.

Martin, along with his father John, have now moved permanently to their home in Combe Martin with Martin's wife Pamela. Many prayers and good wishes for him and his family were shared.



By the time you are reading this the Bishop and the archdeacon will have met with all the churches to formally start the vacancy process. There is always a period where the post of Rector remains vacant whilst the churches consider the direction they feel God is leading them and the nature of the person they are looking for to take on the role. A parish profile is prepared describing the churches and their communities and the qualities we are looking for in our new Rector. The post is then advertised and interviews, led by the Bishop, will take place. It is likely we will not have a Rector in post for at least 9 months.

However the Church wardens and PCCs of the benefice will be working hard to speed along this process along as much as they can!

In the meantime we are very grateful to have the services of Rev Juliet Gosling Brown,our lay readers and lay worship assistants and a number of retired clergy, as well as many visiting clergy who will be taking our weekly services. In his final sermon Rev Martin reflected on the call to serve one another in humility and faith. As Christians in Wiveliscombe and the hills we will endeavour to do this, to serve another and our communities in the best ways that we can as we go forward into this time of vacancy

Anna Chaplaincy for Older People

Shafts of sparkling sunlight flooded the tiny church of St. Luke's over the heads of the waiting congregation of twenty, listening to church organist and choirmaster Tom Morrell's medley of classical pieces which included 'Siciliana' by Walden ending with 'Jig Fugue' by Buxtehude.

That morning, on Sunday 11th of February, the long awaited Anna Chaplaincy commissioning service for Anna Friends was conducted by Rev. Mike Haslam (Chaplain Advisor Acting Mission Development Leader, Bath and Wells) and Rev. Juliet Gosling-Brown (Ordained Distinctive Deacon of St. Andrew's Parish Church, Wiveliscombe and Benefice) Named after the faithful widow 83 year old Anna, who appears with Simeon in Luke's gospel, Anna Chaplaincy is a community-based network that supports older people and their Carers, working across many denominations.

Anna Chaplains work in care homes, private homes, churches, hospitals, and community groups, and are there for people of strong, little or no faith. Male or female, lay or ordained, each works within their local church context with volunteers who work beside them known as 'Anna Friends.' The emphasis is on non-judgemental spiritual support in gentle, loving ways that bring comfort, healing and helping older people to live more peacefully in later years. We also encourage them to reflect on the joys and challenges of their life's journey to foster hope and resilience, but remembering that people's practical struggles can also play a part in their overall well-being.

So it was with great joy that we welcomed our new Anna friends. Judith, for many years a Carer and Activities Facilitator at Pulsford Lodge. Also, Jenny, a former nursery nurse and family support worker and coordinator, and last but not least, Stephen, known for his many years of sterling work as a First Responder and service as sides-person and altar attendant. Bless them all!

Our thanks to Rev. Haslam, Rev. Gosling-Brown, Tom Morrell and to all at St. Luke's for their kind hospitality, not forgetting Brenda and Sherry who fed us chocolate biscuits with tea and coffee after the service! Hazel Ramsay.

News from The Wiveliscombe Town Band

Meet the Band

Continuing our monthly opportunity to meet the musicians of the Town Band, grouped according to the species of instrument they play, we now turn the spotlight on the bass (or tuba) department (although you would need more of a floodlight to get them all in):

Matt says: My late grandfather, who once conducted the band, encouraged me to learn the cornet and I joined the learner band when I was 7 years old. I joined the main band that Christmas so I have now been in the band 33 years with the occasional short break here and there.

I now play bass which suits me much better than the cornet ever did.

Octavia, who is 16, writes: I've been playing the tuba with the Town Band for about six years now and it's



such a great experience. Everyone in the band is so friendly and we get to play a huge variety of pieces from Les Mis' to Hey Jude. I also play the saxophone in the Wivey Wind Band and I love to play in both of these bands because they are a great opportunity to meet people and practice a new hobby!

David is our is our long-suffering librarian and a keen Eb bass player. He says: I started learning music 40 years ago on single Eb bass, and I have been on basses ever since, with brief spells on Bb bass (the biggest and deepest of our brass instruments). I currently play with two other bands: Watchet Town and Burtle Silver. I do like playing marches; a favourite would be "The Florentiner"

Roger plays the Bb bass. He tells us: I am in my tenth year now and I became interested in brass having lived in Yorkshire. I'm not in other bands and I enjoy playing hymns best.

Duncan, who also plays Bb bass, says he is 61 years young, and he adds: Tuba playing has been part of my life since school days. Having started on baritone, I gravitated to the "engine room" quite quickly and I love both the sound and the fact that the pulse of any band emanates from the tuba section. During my playing time I have played in many bands as I moved around with my military career, but now, settled in Wivey, I enjoy playing in the town band and giving something back to the community. I enjoy a diverse range of pieces from traditional marches (especially those with a thumping bass solo to really show what the beast can do!) to concert pieces were supporting the band with that deep rounded sound adds warmth and harmony to the tune.

Planning: The council considered five applications. Once two Declarations of Interest were dealt with, all were progressed as recommended by the Planning Group: two applications were supported (one with comments), one was deferred to the Tree Officer, and two were objected to due to lack of information.



More details can be seen on the town council's Facebook page which includes the monthly report from the planning sub-committee, and full applications including formal approval/rejection outcomes are available at www.somerset.gov.uk/planning.

Finance: A draft budget and precept (the town council's part of each house's overall council tax bill) were proposed by the Finance Committee and approved by the council. A one-off grant to Wiveliscombe Area Partnership was also approved, to assist with their 2024/5 financial challenges arising from the Somerset Council financial emergency and consequent loss of grants. A contractor was selected to carry out the refurbishment of the public toilets to modern standards; this work is expected to take place over the summer.

Report from Somerset Councillors: Somerset Councillor Dave Mansell reported that the Somerset Council budget gap of £87 million for 2024/5 could be met by a combination of savings, use of reserves, "capitalisation" (sale of surplus buildings etc) and a 9.99% increase in council Tax. The last two items require government approval. Work to devolve more services to town and parish councils is continuing. These steps are hoped to buy time to get the council onto an on-going sustainable financial footing through "re-sizing" - which will also require a reduction in staffing levels and further service changes. The final plan for 2024/25 will be approved at meetings of Somerset Council in February. Closer to home, the future of the 25 bus is under threat; traffic wardens are active in Wiveliscombe on most days (64 tickets were issued in December) and the double yellow lines are being corrected; and essential work has been done on trees in Croft Way.

Full minutes will be posted on www.wiveliscombe.com once approved. The next meetings will be held on Mondays 19th February and 18th March 2024 at 7pm in the Community Centre. If you've not read The Elephant's Child, I think you will be dealt with in the way that his family treated him;



This means that the day is exactly as long as the night The days started getting longer back in late December; they'll get longer and longer until 20^{th} June – Midsummer Day. Then they'll get shorter until December 21st – Midwinter Day - when the whole thing starts again.

And on 20th March, the sun will rise due east and set due west – the Spring Equinox; and it will rise and set again similarly on 22 September – the Autumn Equinox.

St Andrew's Church Organ Appeal



Do you love the thrill of the organ ringing out at a Wedding, providing sombre majesty at a funeral or lifting the worship of our Sunday services?

We are blessed with a phenomenal organ at St Andrew's, Wiveliscombe that you may have enjoyed hearing played. Sadly, it is in desperate need of repair to get it back to its full magnificence.

We are inviting you to contribute to our appeal to reach the £10,000 target we need for the repairs. This organ is a vital part of our Wiveliscombe Community Concerts and family celebrations as well as our worship. We hope it is valued by you all.

History of the Organ

The earliest record of this organ in St Andrew's dates back to 1829 when the present church was built. The parish paid £229 to purchase an organ from C Collard of Abbotsfield, Wiveliscombe. This organ, reputed to be a Gray, came from London and was installed on the west gallery. In 1892 J E Minns of Taunton were paid £187, met by public subscription, to improve the organ which they also moved to the southeast end of the south aisle, to the right of the altar.

In 1929 Osmonds of Taunton moved the organ, which at the time had 20 stops, back to the west gallery, where it remains to this day. They installed pneumatic action and added two new stops that were popular at the time; a Violin Diapason on the great and a Quintadena on the Swell. It is a characteristic of this organ that it contains a variety of different tone colours, many of which are quite rare.

The electric blower was installed in 1935 and, following a repair in 1968, it continues to be in use. The organ was cleaned in 1952 and rebuilt in 1975 with electric action, again by Osmonds.

By the mid 1990's it needed a comprehensive refurbishment. This was carried out by Deane Organ Builders of Taunton along with tonal improvements. Some additional stops were added. This improved the organ tonally, but the pedals still lacked depth and clarity and the Great Organ lost its sparkle in a full church.

In 2000 the last major renovation was completed by Deane Organ Builders with the installation of a digitally controlled electric action and additional stops, some of which are produced electronically. This was made possible by the generosity of Dennis and Ann Scotter.

St Andrew's Church Organ Appeal

After 24 years, which is a long time in the life of such an intricate and complicated machine, the organ is in need of a major overhaul of the stop action. 9 of the 30 stops no longer work and this includes 4 of the stops that are used the most. When you hear the organ being played today it is by no means operating at the volume or depth at which it should sound.

Please help us to restore the organ to its very best. We look forward to celebrating with you all with a community concert and a classical concert once the organ is back to its former glory.







Growing in Faith - A message from Bishop Michael New life for all the world

Sowing seeds, chitting potatoes, choosing varieties. Easter acts as starter's orders for the gardening year. Beds are cultivated, lawns mown, plans for all the growth and new life that spring and summer will bring made and then turned into action.

There's a much greater connection between



gardening and Easter than it merely being the time to dust off forks and spades. For in the Bible, a garden is the setting for Easter itself. In John's Gospel (Jn 20:1-18) Mary Magdalene meets the risen Jesus in a garden. Indeed, Jesus's appearance to Mary is so unexpected that at first she can't believe it's really him. So she mistakes the man she meets 'supposing him to be the gardener' (John 20:15).

In John's account, all the new life contained in the first Easter chimes with a much earlier story set in a garden too. This is of the new life of another man and woman, the creation story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and contained in the book of Genesis (Genesis 2:4- 3:24). In that story, Adam is the gardener (Gen 2:15), only for things to go wrong. In John, Jesus is portrayed as the new Adam – come to bring new life that has no end.

What would happen if we were to think of our churches as gardens, primed to welcome the spring that is the new life of Jesus this Easter? What would happen if we imagined ourselves called to be gardeners – like our father Adam and the new Adam, Jesus? What would we expect to grow? What might need pruning or weeding? What new plans for the coming season would we make and turn into action? What would be the harvest that we'd sow for, tend and then reap?

For I reckon we should see Easter as the starting point of all that God wants to do among us and with us. Jesus's resurrection opens us to being part of God's new creation. Easter offers us a fresh start for life, relationships and the life of our churches: new life for all the world.

Happy gardening and a very Happy Easter to you all. Bishop Michael

Growing in Faith - "SHOFARS AND TRUMPETS" Hazel Ramsay

I recently watched an intriguing TV series via my Roku device about four ancient tribes, each still living their separate and differing semi nomadic lives for many thousands of years on the vast plains, in the desert, and along the salt lake of Kenya, East Africa.



I was very surprised to learn that

anthropologists, archaeologists and other experts thought these tribes had descended from Jews migrating from Egypt! But as the film makers delved into the culture and traditions of the tribes, their theory seemed borne out by the fascinating traditions and many religious/spiritual aspects that seemed to mirror even the Jews of today. Some scholars even consider that they may be the ancient 'lost tribes of Israel!'

Well, be that as it may, I noted their use of the Shofar, a ram's horn as a kind of trumpet, still used in Israel to this day. Silver trumpets are also used in Israel but of course no silver trumpets were apparent among the African tribes. However, both types of trumpets were used as a means of mass communication to warn of war, an approaching enemy, pending calamity or high holidays. The Roman army, some of the Greek armies and even the Jewish armies back in Bible times, used trumpets and shofars to signal orders. For example, a first 'trump' or call signalled a man to start his watch on guard duty and then a last 'trump' signalled that his time on guard duty was over. Time to go home and rest!

These trumpet calls were also very effective, and still are, in Jewish religious rituals and times of celebration, as in the Jewish 'Yom Teruah, the day of blowing trumpets'; a call to repent, due next on Sept.15th 2024. By analogy, the scriptures teach us that we are involved in a spiritual war while we continue to live out our lives in this increasingly uncertain and sometimes hostile world. And so, when we hear the Shofar call heralding the rapture, this unmistakable signal, we will know that our part in warfare is over and our fighting in this present age is done in this spiritual war. We are called home!

Let's be on our guard, alert and ready, watching, listening and waiting patiently for Archangel Israfil's trumpet call for might soon to be! (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18) HAZEL RAMSAY.

Growing in Faith - ' Did you know? '

<u>Water</u>

Used in many religions as a sign of cleansing.

In the Old Testament it is a gift of God, in the New a sign of rebirth. Christ was baptised in the R. Jordan. Traditionally water is blessed by a priest, thence Holy Water. Some wells/springs throughout the world are known as holy, Lourdes in Europe is the



notable one. Holy water is used in Baptism, on people and places and in exorcism repelling evil.

Water is mixed with wine in the Holy Communion service, reminding us of Christs death, also the priest hands are 'washed' with water prior this sacred event. Holy water stoups are found in all ancient churches in the UK, some remain in use, mostly now found in Catholic churches, where believers dip their fingers into the water and make the sign of the cross to remind them of their Baptism saying:- In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

<u>Incense</u>

This has been widely used in all religions since 3600BC.

In Judaism/Christianity :-

God breathed into Adam, the nose is a vehicle for smelling/breathing, incense is breathed in, as it represents prayer, this becomes the link with God, one explanation for the use of incense.

See psalm 141 verse 2, in the New testament Revelations Chapter 5 v 8, 8 v 3. Incense is also used as a form of purification. It is used widely in Catholic, some Anglican and Lutheran Churches.



<u>Chasuble</u>

This is from the wearing of a large poncho by farmers and shepherds in the areas around ancient Rome. In the third century, it became associated with Christianity. It's symbolises the yoke of Christ. This seamless garment represents the one worn by Christ at his crucifixion. Usually decorated with a large cross either back or front, this cements the symbolism of Christ's death. Worn over the stole and alb.

The colour is coordinated with the liturgical season/feast . This is a reminder that Holy Communion is a special sacred event.
